### Meet The Playwright



Jez Butterworth was born in London in 1969. His plays include "Mojo" (1995), "The Night Heron" (2002), "The Winterling" (2006), "Parlour Song" (2008), "Jerusalem" (2009), "The River" (2012), and "The Ferryman" (2017). His plays have won two Olivier Awards, three Evening Standard Awards, Four Writer's Guild Awards and Three Critics Circle Awards. In 2007 he was given the E.M. Forster Award by the American Academy of Arts and Letters. His screenwriting credits include Fair Game, Get on Up (2014), Edge of Tomorrow (2014), Black Mass (2015), and Spectre (2015).

### Director's Note

Jez Butterworth has written a twisting turning poem in "The River". An existentialist tale of love and fishing, guts and all. It is my hope that you will allow "The River" to wash over you, that it might in some small way allow you to reflect on your life, and to dream about the life you think you lead.

As a metaphor fly fishing sets the table for this feast of the mind. A river ever-changing reminds us that we can never be in this exact place in time and space again. All we have is the present. No matter what has come or will come, there is always the heartbeat of the present. Our task, perhaps, in our own tales of our own river is to love the living. The mystery at the heart of "The River" exists in the murder of moments that we are not present for, only to be replaced by a longing for something that never was.

The pandemic changed the world. Collectively we find ourselves in this moment. It is a place much different from the world of February 2020. We sit and try to force it back, pretending, play acting as if we can just go back and start again. But of course we can never go back. Ultimately, the beauty and power of this play is like a river with an ever changing surface.

It has been an absolute joy to work with this cast and crew. "The River" is my first show back as a director at Ensemble since 2019. This show has reminded me how hard this work can be, but how rewarding and magical it can be to collaborate with wonderful humans and talented artists. A very special thank you to them and to the Notre Dame College community that has embraced Ensemble as an institution with open arms. Enjoy "The River"...




